**GENERAL ORDER NUMBER 1D (GO-1D) PUBLIC HEALTH MEASURES FOR U.S. ARMY GARRISON STUTTGART**

**APPLICABILITY.** This General Order applies to all individuals stationed, assigned, or attached to U.S. Army Europe units in the USAG Stuttgart area of responsibility. It also applies to all Service Members, Department of the Army Civilians, Department of Defense Civilians, Family Members, and others present on, or seeking access to, the military installations of USAG Stuttgart.

**1. STATEMENT OF MILITARY PURPOSE AND NECESSITY.** This General Order identifies conduct that is prejudicial to the good order and discipline, health, and safety of all personnel within USAG Stuttgart and measures for the preventing the of the spread of COVID-19.<sup>1</sup>

**2. PUBLIC HEALTH MEASURES.** Public health measures, to include restrictions on freedom of movement, enacted by the host nation government in response to COVID-19 will be obeyed on and off military installations.<sup>2</sup> The following additional measures apply to those subject to GO-1D:

a. Unofficial travel for DoD Service members is authorized in accordance with any Department of Defense travel guidance and host nation public health measures.

b. Locations, facilities, or services prohibited from access or use by the host nation will not be accessed, frequented, or used by personnel subject to this General Order. Personnel will adhere to the social distancing/group limits set by the host nation.

c. Quarantine and Isolation. Those subject to GO-1D will not break an official order from a medical authority and/or supervisor regarding quarantine, isolation, and/or conditional release.

**3. PUNITIVE ORDER.** Paragraphs 2, 2a, 2b, and 2c are punitive. Persons subject to the UCMJ may be punished thereunder, face adverse administrative action, or be removed from the installation. Those not subject to the UCMJ may face administrative action such as Bar from the installation, revocation of Individual Logistic Support; involuntary Early Return of Dependents and / or host nation legal penalties.

**4. EXCEPTIONS.** Requests for exceptions of any provision of this General Order for USAREUR personnel must be submitted by the endorsing commander, through the USAG-Stuttgart Commander, to the undersigned for decision. Exceptions for non-USAREUR personnel will be processed through that individual's chain of command.

**5. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This General Order is effective immediately. This General Order rescinds General Order 1C, dated 5 June 2020. It will remain in effect until rescinded by me.

However, consistent with Article 54 of the NATO SOFA Supplementary Agreement, the USAG-Stuttgart commander may deviate from the host nation's measures on a case-by-case basis on the installation when a deliberate risk assessment establishes that public health will not be endangered by doing so.
